





GUATEMALA

- We serve in Guatemala City, the capital, which is home to more than two million people.
- It is estimated that **2,000 people** work as "recyclers" at the city dumpsite, the largest in Central America.
- Underground fires with acrid smoke sporadically break out at the dump. Pungent smells, insects, and animals fill the residential communities surrounding the dump, and chemicals from the dumpsite drain into the nearby river.
- Through a donor-sponsored holistic scholarship program, we're empowering children to change their futures.

Instead of picking through trash, our Samaritan Scholars are in school, picking future careers.
