- We work in the cities of San Pedro Sula and Tegucigalpa, in communities next to the city garbage dump. The adults (and many children) in these communities earn their livelihood by picking through trash for items to sell and use.
- Through a donor-sponsored holistic scholarship program, we're empowering children to change their futures.
